

Elk Rapids District Library Improvement Project Phase 1 – Concept Phase Fact Sheet

- The Library received a generous bequest from the estate of Mr. Charles Heffer in January 2014.
- During the following summer the library consulting firm of Hartzell-Mika conducted interviews, a survey, and two day-long planning sessions to help us develop a strategic plan.
- We discovered that people love the library, but want more - more comfortable seating, a bigger children's area, a place for teens, more programs, better lighting, more gathering places, bigger program spaces, and more materials of all kinds. There are deficiencies in our service due to space limitations.
- The Elk Rapids Village Council has given us permission to explore the possibility of improving and expanding the Library. Developing a concept for improvement and possible expansion is Phase 1 of the Library Improvement Project. Phase 1 will continue until the concept is presented to the Village Council.
- We have hired who we believe are the best architects to help us come up with the concept of what an improved Library might look like. Tamara Burns, Gene Hopkins, and Steve Adams from Hopkins Burns Design Studio specialize in historic preservation and restoration, and Dan Whisler from Daniels & Zermack Architects has many years of experience designing, building, and renovating libraries.
